lan	 Opening Remarks Thanks to: Dave Bucknell for tenacity on highways concerns in particular regarding the swing bridge. Gemma Bates and other volunteers for supporting the school fete where £62 was raised to support the school Gloucester City Council,
4	 Treasurer's Report The bank balance stands at £710. £20 spent on prizes for the stall at the school fete. £250 is ring-fenced for moving the GLRFC defibrillator from inside the building to an outside wall. A letter is being drafted to confirm commitment and timetable for this work. £200 is ring-fenced for a summer party and £25.00 set aside for prizes at a stall to be placed and the school summer fete. Therefore £235.42 is in the kitty unallocated. We are expecting £300 grant from Gloucester City Council to be used for insurance & software licences for 2 years but this is yet to clear We are yet to procure insurance that has been quoted at £9.31 p.c.m.
5	 Committee changes Ian Pickup resigned as Hon Secretary. Only Gareth Steer expressed an interest in the role. He was nominated by Jen Cable, seconded by Gemma bates and voted in unanimously.

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6 Project reports

A. Highways – Dave Bucknell.

A speed survey has been conducted at 3 points on Hempsted Lane, the results have not been analysed.

Met with Alex McIntyre MP who will raise the issue of swing bridge with the council. Alex to ask if partial blocking may allow opening until works commence.

B. Environment and Open Spaces Wayne Subryan & Gemma Bate

The Terracycle bin is back. Now collecting 4 new streams: Pringles tubes with metal bases; BabyBel packaging (wax, net and plastic); Biscuit and cake wrappers as well as rice cakes and crackers; Bread packaging including pitta and wraps etc.

School fete stall raised £62.

C. Media and Website - Kiran Emery

Broken links on contacts page fixed. Gareth to speak to Kiran to get access and training to website to upload minutes and for resilience.

D. Planning and Legislation - Grant Bowden

No significant planning commitments to report.

Consultation for new planning bordering village (Llanthony Road), HRA to raise concerns over impact of lack of parking provision.

Regarding the Belway development, hedges have been trimmed. Concerns have been raised regarding dust from the site, we will continue to monitor the effectiveness of dust suppression methods.

E. Safety & Welfare Chris Royce

There is currently a focus on anti-social behaviour across the city.

Discussion on incidents of ASB from group of youths and poor parking including complaints on Facebook about impact of social media targeting on properties and individuals incorrectly linked to reported poor parking. Clair notes that we cannot resolve these issues on a case-by-case basis. If any parking is illegal or dangerous, it should be reported directly to the local PCSO or the relevant enforcement authority. It is not the role of the HRA to forward such complaints.

The PCSO, Suzanne Sexton, has returned after a period of absence.

Other issues flagged, monitored and escalated as appropriate include: hazards at the "bat caves" off Midsommer Walk where safety barriers had been removed and reporting of needles on the site; abandoned trolleys; and defecation against the church.

F. Technologies - Sue Steggles-Cole

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Written to broadband providers for update on full-fibre plans. Regarding laptop recycling scheme, HRA continues to support. DiBs highlighted target of 12 laptops per year, assume 6 from laptop donations and 6 funded from donations (funding target £1000). Scheme will favour school but be open to residents with other educational needs. G. Easements - Ian Pickup Nothing to report H.
