3	Opening Remarks
3	Grant welcomed everyone to the meeting. He wished to thank to following people: Gemma
	and Jen for help in setting up the VE day event in the Village Hall: DiBs for his tireless work
	on trying to get work done on the Hempsted swing bridge: Wayne and Peter Bowden in their
	work on creating the Tommies and BuildIt for providing the materials for these; Greg Turner
	in creating the Tommies cutouts;
4	Co-Option of Gareth to the committee:
	Proposed by DiBs, seconded by Jen, agreed by show of hands. The committee also agreed
	to add John Byron as an Active Member.
5	Treasurer's Report
	The bank balance stands at £710. £250.00 is ring fenced for moving the GLRFC defibrillator
	from inside the building to an outside wall. £200.00 is ring-fenced for a summer party and
	£25.00 set aside for prizes at a stall to be placed and the school summer fete. This leaves
	about £235.42 in the kitty. DiBs raised the issue of Insurance for the HRA committee. He had
	investigated the market and found a suitable policy for £9.31 a month brokered by Hiscox. He
	will ask councillors if they able to provide grant money to cover this cost which will protect
	committee members against public liability claims. Before we go ahead with getting this
	insurance DiBs was asked to investigate whether the parish had any public liability insurance
	which might be extended to cover our activities. Action DiBs. Should it not prove possible to
	be covered by the parish insurance, the Treasurer has authority to set up the insurance as
6	per the quote obtained.
0	Project Reports 1. Highways – DiBs:
	a. It had to be accepted that no temporary measures to keep the bridge open to
	pedestrians are possible.
	b. Given statements by C&RT and Highways it seems likely the bridge will
	remain closed until mid-late August.
	c. Councillor Trimnell has secured money for a traffic survey on Hempsted Lane.
	It is hoped this will include the stretch near the splay for the Bellway estate
	where there have been 2 near missies.
	d. A request for a count of how many cars turn right off Secunda Way into
	Hempsted Lane is likely to be satisfied through volunteer activity Action DiBs

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- to investigate if such a count has already been done by Highways maybe as part of planning process for Hill Farm development.
- e. The Council have been asked for a survey of the tip road which has no footpath to serve any of the businesses along it.

2. Environment and Open Spaces – Wayne Subryan and Gemma Bate

- a. Wayne has agreed to get together with Jag and Charles Hardiman in May to discuss next steps towards a Neighbourhood plan. Committee await the outcome of this meeting.
- b. Gemma highlighted she is planning a litter pick with the Wombles probably end of Juneish.
- c. Waiting to hear from Nikki about approval for next round of Terracycle as it involves naming the church as a public drop off point. Nobody other than those who want to recycle things will know about it, but it'll need approval from the PCC.

3. Media and Website - Kiran Emery

- a. Kiran sent his apologies. Grant urged committee to look at the website and suggest what else could go on it. Kiran is looking into setting up or creating a forum on the website to enable discussions: https://hempstedra.co.uk/
- b. He is midway through an update of documents on the website, including fixing issues with the map and how it displays on different devices.
- c. Grant is to speak to Kiran about the capability of the website to have user content in a safe area.

4. Planning and Legislation - Grant

a. The Lysons Trust have applied for a change that would ensure 2 fields cannot be declared as public open spaces. HRA have challenged the application in respect of the field below the church, known locally as the sledging field. The council have responded: the Notice does not have any objection process; therefore, the change of status will be made. A request to make this a Village green space can still be submitted up to one year after the status change is announced. Action GBo to review whether the village has a desire to apply for this and to agree if the level of effort this requires is proportionate.

5. Safety and Welfare - Chris Royce

- a. Whilst Chris had nothing to report. Grant asked if any action had been taken to deal with anti-social behaviour associated with youths congregating on the football field. Residents who see this should contact the police. John will contact our councillors to see if there is any money available to put some facilities on to those field, e.g., an outdoor gym. **Action** JB
- b. The parking on Hempsted Lane when a local team are playing football has been raised on the HVNB FP page. **Action** DiBs to investigate.

6. Technology - Sue Steggles-Cole

a. We need an update on the laptop refurbishment scheme.

7. Easements - Ian Pickup:

a. Ian gave an overview of Steve's field Permissive path access change and the application made by a villager to make this a PROW.

8. Development - Jen Caple:

- a. Jen suggested we need more community engagement with HRA website. Could Kiran put a link to it on HVNB FB page? Suggestions for content are linked to maps showing local facilities and footpaths, fields that can be used for recreation.
- b. As a way of increasing HRA involvement with members perhaps we could have occasional open evening drop-in sessions, a bit like MP have surgeries for constituents' issues. **Action** JC and GS to review dates and possible scope of event for the next committee meeting.

a. Grant is interested in hosting a summer party. Action AK to provide advice.
